MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

AFSA offers membership, with voting rights to paid members. AFSA membership dues are \$20. Proceeds from membership dues are used for the annual Book Awards. Dues paying members have access to opportunities such as sponsored conference attendance at the <u>Asian Pacific Americans in Higher Education</u> Conference and sponsored participation in the Leadership Education for Asian Pacifics (LEAP) <u>Advance Program</u>.

In 2022-2023, 10 members paid membership dues and donated to the Book Awards. \$339.31 in membership dues and donations were collected.

ACTIVITIES

In addition to providing specific faculty and staff support, AFSA has also spearheaded additional initiatives, both internally and for the greater Fresno State community.

AFSA Tea Socials

Board Members Gaonucci Belle Vang and Izzy Lo lead two tea socials for members to connect and network. We raffled off multiple gift baskets and provided snacks, drinks, and karaoke at these events.


1:00pm. Quiet reflection space, snacks, and opportunities to be in community were available, along with limited counseling support, provided as necessary.
